



School Risk Protection Policy and Plan

Goal:

Provide a safe and risk-free learning environment for students, teachers, and administrators, through accident prevention and effective emergency response.

Types of potential risks at school

1. Physical hazards: such as slippery floors, unprotected stairs, malfunctioning equipment.
2. Health hazards: such as disease outbreaks, poor ventilation, food contamination.
3. Psychological and behavioral risks: such as bullying, violence, psychological stress.
4. Environmental hazards: such as fires, earthquakes, extreme rains or storms.
5. Security risks: such as strangers entering, infiltration, or losing a child.

Preventive Measures

1. Periodic inspection of facilities:

- Conduct weekly inspection tours to monitor any potential danger (exposed wires, broken furniture...).
- Documenting risks and setting a time plan to address them.

2. Health Safety:

- Follow-up of general hygiene and maintenance of toilets and school canteen.
- Provide sanitizing tools and cleaning materials, especially in classrooms and toilets.
- Training students on healthy behaviors such as washing hands and wearing a mask when needed.



3. Behavioral Safety:

- Implementing an anti-bullying policy in classrooms and yards.
- Provide a student counselor or psychologist to support students psychologically and behaviorally.

4. Safety in Emergencies:

- Develop a clear evacuation plan with signboards in the corridors.
- Conduct periodic evacuation drills in cooperation with the Civil Defense or the concerned authorities.
- Equipping the school with fire extinguishers and effective alarms.

5. Supervision and Control:

- Securing school gates and registering visitor data.
- The presence of permanent supervision in the courtyard and yards at the time of recess and queue.

Third: The Role of Teachers and Administrators

- Monitor students' behavior and guide them to follow preventive instructions.
- Immediately report any danger or accident to the school administration.
- Participate in safety training.

Fourth: The role of students

- Compliance with security and safety instructions.
- Report any unsafe situation or danger they are witnessing.
- Participate in evacuation and emergency handling exercises.

Fifth: Review and Update

- The school's risk protection policy is reviewed at least every academic year.
- They are adjusted according to changes in the school environment or the recommendations of the competent authorities.
